5. **Adoption of the third revision of the Kent Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) Management Plan (Pages 39 - 188)**

The Countryside and Rights of Way (CROW) Act 2000 requires local authorities to produce, adopt and keep under review Management Plans for Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). The Kent Downs AONB covers 24% of the district, predominantly in the northern half, but also running east-west through Saltwood and Lympne and, working with other authorities in the Kent Downs AONB, a review has been undertaken to update the current plan for the period 2021 – 2026.

All 12 local authorities with land area within the Kent Downs AONB are legally required to adopt the same AONB Management Plan.

This report proposes adoption of the reviewed document, which strongly reflects the existing, already adopted plan.
